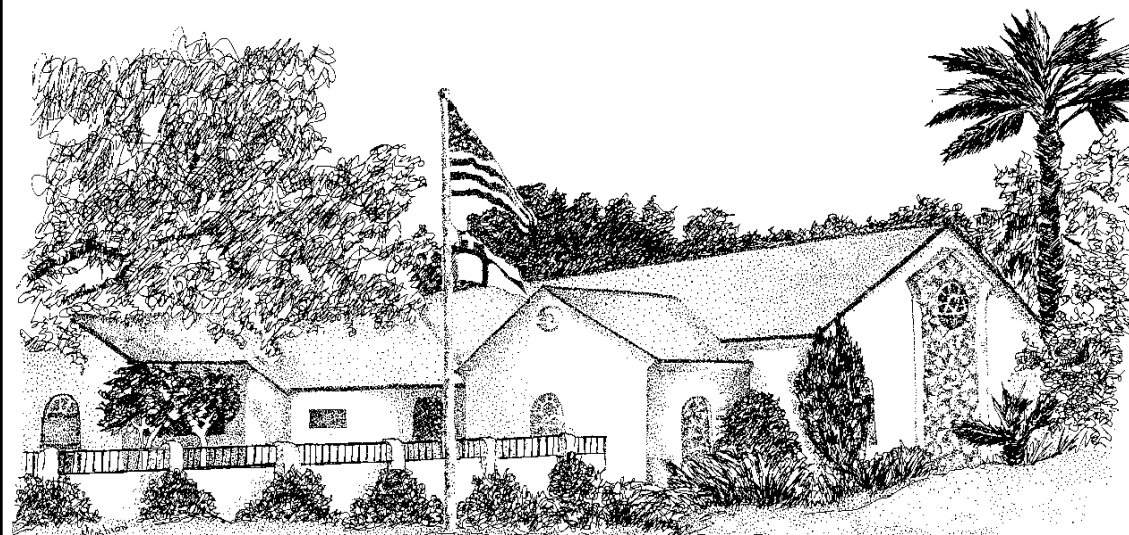

"ROGATION" SUNDAY AND ROGATIONTIDE ~ According to old Anglican custom, the Sunday before the feast of the Ascension (and the three days following) are kept as a minor season of fasting in the Calendar known as "Rogationtide." The name derives from the Latin, *rogare*, "to ask, beseech; pray for." Originally, this period of the year was consecrated particularly to prayers for temperate weather and rains sufficient for the early growth of crops. Joined to these prayers there emerged a custom of keeping a procession around the physical boundaries of the parish church, a practice known as the "beating of the bounds." As the Church has pivoted from an agrarian context, and as physical parish boundaries have dissolved (in the age of the automobile and ecclesiastical disestablishment), the keeping of a "modern" Rogationtide has shifted to a more general consideration of our corporate stewardship of those good gifts with which God has blessed us, as well as to prayers for the good prosperity of our labor—whatever line of work we're in! This year, St. Alban's will observe its "beating of the bounds" in company with ESI on Monday, May 6, at 8:20 am; all members of the parish are welcome to attend.
