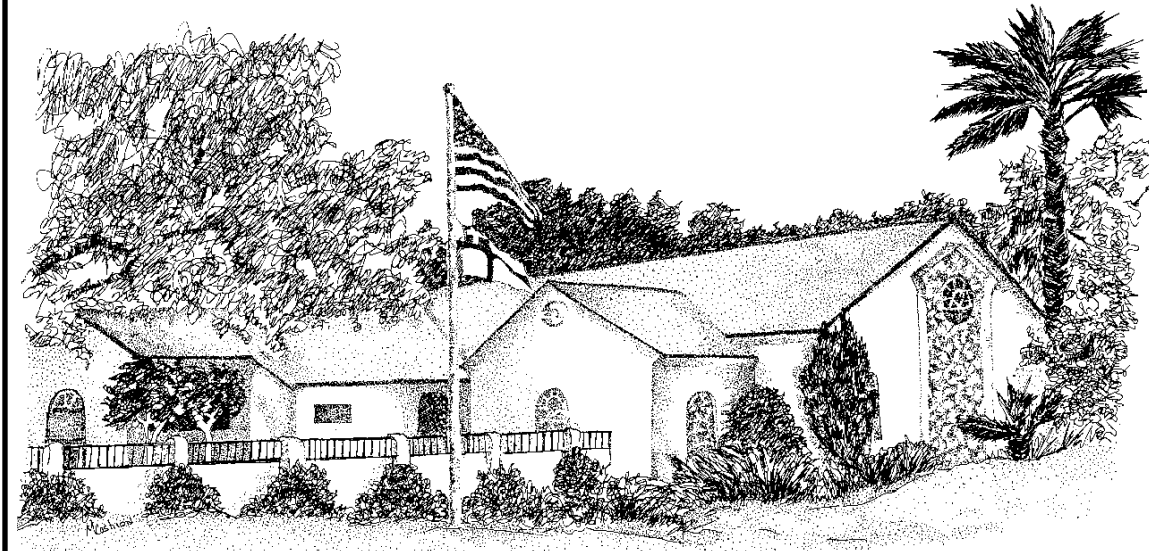

The Lord guided the righteous in right paths, shewed him the kingdom of God, and gave him knowledge of holy things, made him rich in his travails, and multiplied the fruit of his labours. In the covetousness of such as oppressed him he stood by him, and made him rich. And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me. He that findeth his life shall lose it, and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it. He that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me. He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward; and he that receiveth a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward. And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward."

SAINT ALBAN: our patron saint, is venerated as the protomartyr of Britain. He was a pagan Roman citizen who lived in the early third century in the Roman city of Verulamium. One day he gave shelter to a stranger fleeing from persecution. This stranger was a Christian priest, now known as Amphibalus. While sheltering the priest, Alban was inspired by the priest's faith and eventually turned to Christ. It was not long before the Roman authorities caught up with Amphibalus. However, Alban's new-found faith would not allow him to let the authorities arrest the priest. Instead, Alban exchanged clothes with Amphibalus and was arrested, allowing the priest to escape. Alban refused to renounce his faith and the magistrate ordered that he should receive the punishment intended for the escaped priest. Upon this ruling, Alban was led out of Verulamium and up the hillside where he was beheaded. His grave on this hillside quickly became a place of pilgrimage.

INDEPENDENCE DAY (JULY 4): The Calendar of the American branch of the Anglican Church includes two "national" feast-days: Thanksgiving Day, and Independence Day. The Propers for both feasts emphasize the reality of a "national covenant." In a word, the Church recognizes on these days that the blessings of order, liberty, and prosperity which a political constitution provides to its citizens is dependent on the mercy and favor of God, and also that the continuance of those blessings is tied to our national obedience, faithfulness, and charity. Join us this Independence Day for a **10:00 am mass** as we gather to give thanks to God for the gift of our country.
